Capital Campaign Enters Critical Phase with Chapter House Construction on the Horizon

Thinking back on our own experiences from our days as undergraduate members of Eta Kappa, we draw on the lifelong friendships that began there and the positive influence that Sigma Chi has had on our personal and professional lives.

We thank the Eta Kappa alumni who have supported our chapter by volunteering their time and providing financial support. Now, the clock is ticking as we enter a critical phase of our drive to reach our \$1.5 million capital campaign goal. That goal must be attained to keep our project on pace for summer 2021 construction start-up.

So far, the *Foundation for the Future of Eta Kappa* campaign has been remarkable in two ways. First, the personal level of commitment from a core group of our alumni has been extraordinary, representing an average of more than \$13,000.
